**Civil Society Advocacy to Support Anti-Corruption in Nigeria (CASAN)**  
**Call for application from consultants to undertake research in UNCAC implementation in Nigeria**  
– November 22, 2016

## **Background**

The Africa Network for Environment and Economic Justice (ANEEJ), solicits application from consultants in pursuance of the project “Civil Society Advocacy to Support Anti-Corruption in Nigeria (CASAN), a 9 months project currently been implemented by ANEEJ with support from UNDP under the EU founded 10<sup>th</sup> European Development Fund (EDF). The goal of the project is to enhance the capacity of CSOs and journalists to support anti-corruption effort in Nigeria.

The project objectives include;

- Build the capacity of CSOs and Media on the concept of Open Government Partnership (OGP) and the UNCAC to support their policy advocacy around the issues by end of project.
- Engage the relevant arm/agencies of government on the implementation of Open Government Partnership (OGP) and the UNCAC
- Raise public awareness through the launch of the “support open government partnership” campaign

As part of the project implementation, a research is expected to be under taken to provide insight into the implementation on United Nations Convention Against Corruption (UNCAC) in Nigeria. The information generated will also be used as part of training materials for CSOs and journalist.

## **Scope**

The focus of the research is the UNCAC implementation and review with emphasis on the second review cycle of UNCAC (2015-2020) which will cover Chapter 11 preventive measures and Chapter V on asset recovery as well as other chapters relevant to support the anti-corruption process in Nigeria. The research also involves the assessment of Nigeria’s implementation of United Nation Convention Against Corruption (UNCAC). The consultancy services will also include facilitation of the two workshops.

## **Consultant Terms of Reference**

The Terms of Reference for the research work include;

- review UNCAC implementation in Nigeria and how Nigeria has fared so far with the implementation of recommendations from the first review, and identify gaps
- identify laws needed to support the implementation of UNCAC in Nigeria
- discuss the second review cycle of UNCAC (2015-2020) which will cover Chapter 11 preventive measures and Chapter V on asset recovery as well as other chapters relevant to support the anti-corruption process in Nigeria
- the consultant may need to meet with officials at the Ministry of Justice and/or EFCC leadership if need be
- Submit an initial draft report to ANEEJ for input
- Submit final report to ANEEJ after incorporating the input/comment
- From the report prepare power points to be used for training at a later date

## **Responsibility and Timelines for the Consultant**

The consultant will work within two weeks to deliver on initial report beginning from the day the contract is signed. Thereafter, deliver the power point presentations in another two days. The first draft of the report is to be delivered within 9 days. Comments (if necessary) will be made in 2 days and returned for additional work. Final work will be delivered no later five days after. The Report shall be considered completed after all requests for reviews may have been addressed by the consultant, and when the final output is accepted by ANEEJ.

### **Fee**

The fee for the consultancy is 125,000. Additional resource will be provided for expenditure relating to the training

### **The consultant shall have the following qualifications:**

- Familiar with the UNCAC implementation (membership of UNCAC coalition will be an added advantage)
- At least 5 years of proven experience working on development issues especially in an NGO setting.
- Should also have research experience and be knowledgeable about policy issues and conversant with policy analysis.
- Clear, effective writer in English.
- Excellent verbal skills in English
- Experience facilitating workshop

### **Installments (fees)**

- 60% of consultancy fees at moment of contract.
- 40% on acceptance of final report by ANEEJ including the power point presentation
- Additional fee will be paid later to facilitate 2 trainings to be held in Abuja and Lagos within the first quarter of 2017. ANEEJ will communicate the dates for the training to the consultant
- ANEEJ will additionally, take care of transport, accommodation and feeding for the consultant to deliver the trainings where such expenses are required.

The deadline for the applications is December 3, 2016. Only shortlisted applicant will be contacted.

### **Ownership**

The report will be owned by ANEEJ which shall acknowledge the intellectual input of the consultant.
