



JOINT MONITORING MODE: FACTORS TO CONSIDER




DATA COLLECTION & SKILLS SET

REQUIRED SET SKILLS


- The team (Government and CSO monitors) should have the following skills:





FEEDBACK CHANNELS

- This refers to flow of raw data from the point of collection to an aggregation point – office@lite-africa.org, info@aneej.org
- Process flow: raw data gathered by CSOs at community, LGAs & States forwarded to coordinating centre
- State coordinating centre analyses data, validates and generate comprehensive report
- ANEEJ & LITE-Africa puts report together for Public/NDDC etc
