



## **REQUEST FOR APPLICATION FROM RESOURCE PERSONS TO FACILITATE 2-DAY CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP FOR HOST COMMUNITY GROUPS ON UNCAC COALITION GUIDE - CIVIL SOCIETY AND PRIVATE SECTOR**

### **Background**

The Africa Network for Environment and Economic Justice (ANEEJ) is implementing the **“Enhancing Anti-corruption and Social Inclusive Reform Initiatives in Nigeria”** project. ANEEJ has received funding from Palladium under the Strengthening Civic Advocacy and Local Engagement (SCALE) project supported by USAID. ANEEJ is working with eight organisations under the anchor-cluster model as the anchor organization. The cluster is composed of Anti-Corruption-focused CSOs drawn from NGOs, Faith-Based Organizations, Gender-based and Persons with Disability. The project is designed to strengthen the capacity of CSOs and journalists as advocates to engage government on anti-corruption and social inclusive policy reforms issues at the national level and in six oil and gas producing States (Edo, Delta, Abia, Imo, Rivers and Ondo States). It will equally advocate for transparency, accountability and reforms within the Niger Delta Development Commission (NDDC) and the five Oil and Gas Producing Areas Development Commissions in the Niger Delta. The project will also be engaging government on commitments made during London Anti-corruption Summit and the Global Forum on Asset Recovery.

The project is hinged on the premix that when CSOs, journalists and host community groups are trained on anti-corruption and social inclusive reforms issues, and have the right knowledge and skills to engage government collaboratively based on data, they will be able to carry out evidence-based advocacy for reforms. Then, they can influence the development of policies, passage of laws on anti-corruption and social inclusive reforms issues.

A major activity under the project is a two-day capacity building workshop for 30 host community groups comprising of women groups, CSOs, media, professional groups, CBOs and FBOs on the United Nation Convention Against Corruption (UNCAC) Coalition Guide for Civil Society and Private Sector. The workshop holding in Port Harcourt will include women groups for sessions on Gender Responsive Participatory Budgeting and ANEEJ seeks the service of a Resource Person that will deliver the workshop.

### **ToR for Resource Person**

ANEEJ seeks to engage a Resource Person who will work with the following ToR.

- Prepare materials for the training for 30 participants mainly women groups, CSOs, media, professional groups, CBOs and FBOs
- Design the agenda in line with the focus and facilitate the two-day workshop

The training will focus on the following:

- Understanding the UNCAC Coalition Guide on Civil Society and the Private Sector
- How CSOs can use the Guide to engage the Private Sector (including oil companies) and state owned companies such as NDDC and oil and gas commissions in the Niger Delta
- Increasing participants understanding of the concept of Private Sector and strategic engagement with the sector on anti-corruption, transparency and accountability issues (In this context private sector and state owned companies such as NDDC and oil and gas commissions in the Niger Delta)
- Educating participants on how the UNCAC Coalition Guide can be a useful tool for stakeholders engagement
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- How private sector engagement expertise be increased within a CSO

The resource person will guide participants to develop an advocacy message/structured letter to request for engagement with the leaders of the Private Sector (including oil companies) and state owned companies such as NDDC and oil and gas commissions in the Niger Delta

### **Timeline**

The Resource Person have a total of 8 days to deliver on the assignment, broken down as follows;

- 5 days - design the necessary materials for the training including agenda and submit draft to ANEEJ
- 1 day – review draft materials based on feedback from ANEEJ, respond to feedback and submit agenda for the event
- 2 days – facilitate the workshop for 30 participants in Port Harcourt

### **Milestones/deliverable for the Resource Person**

- Workshop materials including agenda
- Advocacy message/letter jointly developed with the participants
- Workshop facilitation

### **Expertise required for the Resource Person**

The consultants shall have:

- I. Minimum of BSc
- II. Minimum of five years' experience in development work with clear understanding of issues of UNCAC processes and other anti-corruption issues
- III. Experienced in facilitating capacity building workshops with knowledge of advocacy issues and campaigns
- IV. Detail-oriented; demonstrated ability to multi-task and meet client deadlines

### **Contract**

ANEEJ will enter into contract with the Resource Person to signal the commencement of the work which will terminate on completion of the assignment based on stated timelines.

### **Fee**

A total of N200,000 is available for this assignment.

### **Date of Workshop**

The workshop date is tentatively fixed for Thursday 28 and Friday 29<sup>th</sup> July 2022 in Port Harcourt beginning from 9am daily. The exert venue is yet to be confirmed. This will be communicated to the Resource Person
